- V. Barn Grant Applications**
Prior to the meeting, Caitlin Corkins supplied council members with electronic and hard copy information for each of the forty-eight applications to be considered for the 2016 Historic



Preservation Barn Grants for their review. The council has \$232,517 available funding to award out of the \$627,887 in application requests. Council members viewed a power point presentation that summarized each application, after which they had an opportunity to ask Caitlin questions and discuss the various components of each project.

A complete list of the applications awarded will be put on the Division for Historic Preservations website once all applicants have been notified of the results. Barbara George moved to fund the twenty applications with four alternates. Helen Whyte seconded. The motion carried 7-0.
